Evac 1-2-3 utilizes patient's MR number to ensure reliable tracking throughout the entire evacuation process. A room door tag component prioritizes patient movement while the patient tag tracking component documents room evacuation, transports and destination arrival. Compatible with any electronic patient tracking system.

1 Room Evacuation

When a patient is removed from a room, staff removes and retains the evacuation receipt and brings the patient to the staging area.

2 Transportation

Command Boards IMT Vests Evacuation Tabletop Training

- The 4 Core Compliance Elements
- 1. Emergency plan – Develop an emergency plan based on a risk assessment and a "all-hazards" approach, which will provide an integrated system that addresses all potential hazards.
 - 2. Policies and procedures – Develop and implement policies and procedures that address the provision of subsistence needs, such as food, water and medical staff and residents, whether they evacuate or shelter in place.
 - 3. Communication plan – Develop and maintain a communication plan that addresses the provision of subsistence needs, such as food, water and medical staff and residents, whether they evacuate or shelter in place.
 - 4. A training and testing program – Develop and maintain training and testing programs, including initial training in policies and procedures. Facility must demonstrate knowledge of emergency procedures and provide training and testing to test the emergency plan.

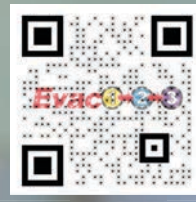
